Capital Regions Integrating Collective Transport for Increased Energy Efficiency (CAPRICE)

CAPRICE, which stands for "Capital Regions Integrating Collective Transport for Increased Energy Efficiency", constitutes a European project within the framework of the European Union's regional policy as an INTERREG IVC project.

In CAPRICE, five public transport authorities from European capital regions exchange experiences and good practices with the aim of offering better services to passengers and increasing the energy efficiency of public transport. The project has a duration of 33 months from 2009 to 2011. CAPRICE seeks to increase the efficiency and quality of services in public transport, to improve public transport as an energy-efficient system by means of proper organisation, integration and use of innovative technical solutions, and to implement policies to foster the accelerated introduction of "clean" vehicle fleets in European capital regions. The key components of CAPRICE concern exchanging experiences between public transport authorities and operators, regional and local governments in seven thematic workshops, transferring knowledge and good practices between the project partners and, finally, carrying out two pilot implementations.
